# **Summary**

## **Chapter 20: Duty of Disclosure**

Section 2001 – Duty of Disclosure, Candor, and Good Faith

- The USPTO imposes a duty of candor and good faith on every individual associated with the filing and prosecution of a patent application. This duty extends to the patent applicant and his representatives, such as attorneys and patent agents that assist in the prosecution or preparation of a patent.
- A breach of this duty is considered <u>inequitable conduct</u>. Specifically, this includes:
  - (1) misrepresentation of material facts
  - (2) failure to disclose material information
  - (3) submission of false information

coupled with intent to deceive or mislead the USPTO.

- A finding of <u>inequitable conduct</u> is made by a court and it renders the claims of a patent **unenforceable**.
- An applicant, or another party with a duty to disclose, generally complies with his duty by submitting information to the USPTO using an information disclosure statement (IDS).

NOTE: Third parties may **not** file an IDS. They are limited to protests or submissions, discussed above.

• A IDS is a concise written statement listing information, such as publications, technical journals, and other activities that may affect the patentability of a pending application.

NOTE: Since provisional applications are not examined, IDS should NOT be submitted.

- A fee is not normally required with the submission of an IDS. However, a fee is required if it is filed after a notice of allowance or final rejection.
- If an IDS is received after payment of an issue fee, it will merely be placed in the application file with no further action.
